Next Sunday, 23rd April, St Mary's will host two important civic services:

First, Walton & Weybridge Scouts come to church for their **St George's Day Service** at 3pm, preceded by a parade through Walton starting at 2.35 pm.

Then, at 6.30 pm, we hold our annual **ANZAC Commemoration**, when we remember the New Zealanders who died at Mount Felix hospital (see below) and are buried in the cemetery. This is followed by wreath laying, then refreshments in the Hall. Everyone is most welcome.

The Mount **Felix Commemoration** Tapestry is now on show at the Riverhouse Barn until 14th May, 10am until 4pm. Some of our church ladies stitched a panel depicting St Mary's Church called 'The First Funeral'. lonny and Cathy actually put in a stitch at the last moment! It was a very evocative panel showing the heads of soldiers tumbling around the church tower that is embedded in the quiet greenery that is still a feature. The 44 finished panels are an amazing achievement, telling the story of Mount Felix as a hospital for ANZAC troops in WWI and is well worth a visit.
