So how hard is it for us in our cold climate to think of Jesus entering the hot, dry desert, where he was tempted by the devil at the start of his ministry?




weather.


What signs of life are there in our spiritual lives? What will help us come closer to God this year? Music? Walks with the Lord? Giving up some luxuries?

# **Focus on Mission**

Outward Giving 2023
Sharing the love of Jesus
with all people Matthew 28:16-20

This month we are focusing on Barnabas Fund, one of our Mission Partners for 2023.

Barnabas Fund works to provide hope and aid for the persecuted Church, from Christians, to Christians, through Christians. It does this by providing practical help and support to persecuted Christians across the world, using local churches to identify who should receive the aid.



Within the UK, Barnabas Fund provides both a bi-monthly magazine and a daily prayer diary to supporters. In the most recent year for which figures are available, Barnabas Fund:

- Educated 13,900 children in 137 school/institutes
- Provided leadership & theological training to 9,700 people
- Supported 54 evangelists and 5 pastors
- Gave 3,000 New Testaments and 28,000 Christian books
- Helped 495,000 disaster victims in 40 countries
- Helped 13,000 people in 9 medical projects in 6 countries
- Helped 19,000 people with small business livelihood projects
- Helped 36,000 victims of violence and injustice
- Helped 900 converts in 6 countries
- Assisted 29,000 people with regular feeding programmes

For example, in Nigeria last year over 6,000 Christians were killed by Islamists (Boko Haram, Fulani tribesmen and Islamic State West Africa Province). That is the equivalent of one Christian being killed every 1½ hours. Barnabas Fund provided a variety of help to Christians whose homes had been attacked or crops destroyed, such as food, sleeping mats and blankets, zinc roofing sheets and roofing nails.

### **Diocese of Guildford Link with Nigeria**

The Diocese of Guildford is linked in a partnership with the Church of Nigeria in what is the longest standing companion link in the Anglican Communion.

Today, Nigeria is one of the largest new centres of Christianity; the Anglican Church of Nigeria alone has over 20 million members. It is a vibrant and fast-growing church increasing by over 70 dioceses within

the past two decades. Over this time, we have exchanged mission visits and clergy for training and parish placements. We now have Nigerian clergy serving in some of our parishes.

Keith Malcouronne, who chairs our diocesan Nigeria Link Committee, describes the link as exciting but not always comfortable. He writes: "We are committed as Church and diocese to mutual prayer and learning between Guildford and Nigeria. We work in very different social and cultural contexts - community divisions, extensive poverty, corruption and the widespread persecution of Christians is something that our Nigerian friends face day to day. Nevertheless, we have much to learn from one another. Our mission and prayer can be enriched and strengthened by our continuing Link and by the deeper understanding it enables between sisters and brothers from such diverse cultures."

The Diocese has asked Parishes to consider forming a link with the Church in Nigeria. We have started conversations to explore whether we could have a constructive and mutually beneficial link. This is in the very early stages of exploration and consideration. Your prayers about this would be greatly appreciated.

# **Messy Church**



#### Living In Love & Faith

Bishop Andrew writes:

This has been a challenging week in the life of the Church of England, with the release of the long-awaited Bishops' Response to 'Living in Love and Faith'. A leak

24 January 2023

on the Tuesday evening didn't help anyone, setting off a series of rumour mills, which morphed into spinning machines when the full details emerged. And the atmosphere has been somewhat febrile ever since, though not for everyone or in every church community.

Beneath the spin, the reality is that the bishops have declined to change the doctrine of the Church of England, whilst simultaneously providing potential prayer resources for the qualities or 'goods' of permanent, faithful, same-sex partnerships, to be used by those who feel able to do so. To some that is a sensible compromise, to others — on both sides of the divide - a disappointment or cause for deep concern.

The report is clear that the bishops themselves have been far from unanimous in our conclusions, a theme that won't surprise anyone (except that previous reports have generally been less honest). Maintaining our inherited doctrine of marriage is, for some of us, a red line issue; for others it is negotiable. The suggested prayers, for some of us, go too far; for others, not far enough. We have all met Christians who identify as L, G, B, T or I and who haven't felt welcomed in the life of the Church – so that our apology is genuine and shared. We have equally met LGBTI Christians who have taught us much about the grace of God on which we all depend, for whose fellowship and ministry in the life of our parishes we are profoundly grateful.

The Bishops' Response isn't the end of the story. It is simply the next stage in a process which will now lead to February's General Synod and need considerable work thereafter. So could I ask, at this point, that we don't jump to premature conclusions or get taken in by the spin. Could I encourage us to be gentle with one another in an area which has such great sensitivities for so many. And could I invite you to pray for me and our General Synod reps in the weeks ahead, and for the whole Church of England during quite such a stormy time.
