Whatever next?

As we look at our world, we may wonder what is going on. It is a year on from the invasion of Ukraine by Russia, there is huge suffering following the devastating earthquake in Turkey and Syria, others suffer from famine and still others from floods. We attended a study day on Climate change last week and the science paints a frightening picture about global warming and the future of the planet. The Church of England is wrestling with the issues of sexuality and marriage and we may well want to ask 'What is going on?' and 'Where is God in all this?'

Well, first, God is not surprised by any of this. Jesus said: "You will hear of wars and rumours of wars, but see to it that you are not alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come. Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be famines and earthquakes in various places. All these are the beginning of birth pains." Matthew 24:6-8.

Secondly, I am comforted that Jesus is there in the midst of the suffering with people in their troubles and, as Easter Sunday every year reminds us, Jesus died and rose again to bring hope to every one of us. He goes on to say: "but the one who stands firm to the end will be saved." As followers of Jesus, we do not bury our heads and pretend all is well. As we stand firm in faith, we can also reassure those around us. We can embrace the present with joy because we have Jesus with us. We can face the future with hope, knowing that God's Love is amazing. When life is tough, Hope is at hand.

We hope you find one of the Lent booklets "Dust and Glory" or "Embracing Justice" helpful to strengthen your faith during Lent. Details of Easter services are in this letter as are Bishop Andrew's response to General Synod, Fairtrade Fortnight, Fusion Mission Partners, Ashley school Prayer space and ways to pray about the Earthquake.

TURKEY-SYRIA EARTHQUAKE – Our Response

There is a collection taking place to for the Disaster Fund through Tear Fund. Donations can be made in cash or through the church Bank account with a note to designate your gift. Below are some suggestions on how to pray and it is good news that 50% of the Bishop of Guildford's Lent Appeal will also go to this Fund.

Tear Fund Guide on How to pray for the Turkey-Syria Earthquake What to pray for...

There are **four** areas to focus our prayers on: **Pray for the emergency response**



- Pray for energy and strength for first responders as they work around the clock to save lives.
- Pray for good weather so the rains and snow do not slow down the response.
- Hospitals in the areas affected are overflowing. In Syria, many hospitals have not been rebuilt since they were destroyed in the conflict there. Pray for resilience for health workers as they respond; pray for capacity to treat people who are injured and for resources – medicine, equipment and hospital beds – to be readily available.

Pray for people affected by the earthquake

- Pray for comfort for those who have lost their loved ones and healing for people who are injured. Pray that vulnerable people will be protected.
- Pray for provision of safe shelter, food, clean water and warmth for people who have lost their belongings, homes and livelihoods. Ask God to give them courage and strength to face these new challenges.

Pray for our church partners in Syria

- Tearfund's local church partner is responding now. Pray for wisdom and resources as they respond to people's immediate needs and plan for how they can support communities in the long-term.
- Pray that the work they are doing to support others will inspire other churches across the region to unite in action to care for communities in need.

Pray for peace

Conflict broke out in Syria in 2011. Much of the country now lies in ruin. The city of Aleppo, which was badly hit by the earthquake, is home to millions of people who have already faced devastating conflict. Many people in northern Iraq, who are rebuilding after years of conflict, and in Lebanon, also felt the earthquake tremors.

- Pray for a lasting peace and recovery for Syrians who have suffered more than a decade of conflict.
- Pray for peace and comfort as people are further traumatised by the earthquake and already are feeling anxious, depressed and fearful. Pray that people will not lose hope – even in these challenging times.

New open doors: we're beginning to get invites to do small groups and mission training with some churches like these guys in Bilbao in the photo who are keen to release their students in leadership and see the small group they have grow and multiply!

Granada Relationships: we'll be helping run student alpha this term with the fab team pictured and the new brilliant, charismatic priest who has taken on the catholic student group in Granada. It has been paused for a while, but we are hoping to see a thriving, missional community there, and to learn in the process how to start a catholic student ministry from scratch to help others.







Establishing Fusion Spain: We nearly have a website ready to go (woohoo!), we're ready to sell Victoria the Van (giving us a helpful small central fund!) & we may have found a loophole way of starting a charity. BUT we still need board members - the *right, committed* board members (ideally 3) in order to make any progress.

New Projects: we have begun to work on *culturally* translating our Prep for Uni material (helping youth prepare for university with bold faith - much needed here!) with a friend who works with Agape youth. Her cultural insight is helping us

dream up ideas together both for prep for university and engaging church leaders. *Watch this space...*

- For 3 board members and a clear pathway (that we have peace or some confirmation on) for setting up a charity

- That the opportunities we're given to speak into churches would be fruitful and catalytic, so we could see more students find Jesus through them!

- For more open doors: we'd love to run a 'prep for uni' weekend in summer for youth around Spain, and a course on starting a student ministry for church & youth leaders next year, but these will take lots of answered prayers, right connections and things falling into place for them to happen & truly serve the church!

Bishop Andrew's reflection on General Synod February 2023

"Dear Friends and Colleagues,

One of the benefits of the long debate on *Living in Love and Faith* in last week's General Synod is that all the cards were placed on the table and done so in a passionate but generally courteous way. At the end of it, a motion was passed which:

- Repented of the harm done to LGBTQI+ people by the Church
- Embedded the Pastoral Principles in the life of the Church of England; and
- Welcomed the decision made by the House of Bishops to replace 'Issues in Human Sexuality' in due course, and to refine, commend and publish 'Prayers of Love and Faith.'

Just one amendment was passed out of the 28 tabled, emphasising that nothing provided by the House of Bishops should depart from the doctrine of the Church of England.

The matter now returns to the House of Bishops who will need to decide the content of the prayers and pastoral guidance and bring the final package back to Synod; so that no further action is required at this stage in our parishes. The bishops will have a great deal to bear in mind, not least the continuing disagreements within all three Synodical Houses, and the wider ramifications of what we're doing within the Church, the Nation and the Anglican Communion; and the Archbishop of York opened up the idea of a 'settlement' towards the end of the debate – some kind of robust framework to protect consciences on all sides – which will require further consideration in the months to come.

Many thanks to our Guildford General Synod reps, who will be sharing their own reflections in a forthcoming meeting of our Diocesan Synod; and for our fellowship together across our own deep differences in this area. I suspect we all voted in different directions at different moments; but, speaking for myself, I was very aware that the cancellation of our first College of Bishops' meeting had contributed to a report that was put together at considerable speed and which left many questions unanswered; so I didn't feel able to support it in the House or in the subsequent debate at Synod.

Wherever we stand, though, let's continue to pray for God's wisdom and grace in the months ahead, and especially for those most affected by our thoughts and deliberations.
