








Coronation Celebrations

A new Season

Dear Friends,

It is an exciting time in our gardens and the world around us, as plants burst into leaf and flower in glorious colour as summer approaches. There are seasons in our world and seasons in our lives and the church too. It is an exciting time for our church as we restructure the leadership team and welcome a new PCC. Cathy has now started her new role working for the Diocese two days per week overseeing all the curates in training. She has reduced her days in church and this will go down to two days in September. The biggest change for the church is that, where we have shared the leadership, Jonny is now leading the Team and some of the areas Cathy has been covering will need to be covered by someone else. The PCC, recognising the gaps we already have in Youth and Children and Families ministry, have created a new role for an Associate Minister with particular responsibility for the discipleship of adults and children, youth and schools ministry. Although we have some funds to cover this post, we will need to dig deep and all consider how much we are able to contribute to this person's salary on a regular basis.

This is a step of faith for us all, and we must be praying for the right person to step into this position and for required funds to be forthcoming.

Berenice Page's Ordination 2nd July

I am to be ordained on the 2nd July at 10:30 at Guildford Cathedral.



I have had to articulate my calling on many occasions in the last few years. Even though I can specifically recall events in the last few years there is no doubt that my life experiences are all part of the process in preparing for such a calling.

Particularly poignant in the process was my time as church warden. This was interesting as I distinctly heard God's voice encouraging me to offer myself for this role. I was sat in church as, yet another appeal was being made to the congregation. I remember the sense of disbelief

being communicated that nobody in the congregation was prepared to consider this role. I quickly dismissed this idea or so I thought. God had different ideas as I could not erase the thought that had been planted.

On becoming church warden, I decided to be studious and read the church wardens handbook but left out the last chapter which was about a vacancy. Only to discover 6 months into the role that the vicar was leaving! This was a role that God certainly equipped me for. The time as warden was pivotal for my move into ministry. God equipped me for the task but widened my horizons to other aspects of ministry.

Then began this small voice that was persistent. Initially I thought I felt a connection to ordained ministry as members of my family were ordained. As time progressed it became clearer that I might be being called to ordained ministry.

Within the first few weeks of Jonny and Cathy joining the Parish I made an appointment to see them and told them how I felt. The servant course was a revelation, and I hadn't attended anything like this previously. I was surprised to find out that my conviction for music in worship was a passion and a form of ministry. God has always and still does speak to me through the words in music. It was a privilege to be part of the worship group and certainly God equipped us and was very much at the centre of the group.

I finally was recommended for training in July 2020 after many years of discernment. I began training in lockdown and spent the first year on Zoom. Here I am – hopefully to be ordained on July 2nd. I just want to say 'thank you' for all your support and encouragement. I am so grateful for the kind words and at times words of affirmation. I will miss worshipping with you and being part of the Parish.

I feel fortunate to be going to be going to St Paul's Church Addlestone to serve as a curate. I leave you with the words of the hymn by Charlotte Elliot, words I have found to be encouraging during the process. It is a hymn about salvation and God's call to us all:

Just as I am - without one plea, But that Thy blood was shed for me, And that Thou bidst me come to Thee, O Lamb of God, I come. Just as I am - of that free love The breadth, length, depth, and height to prove Here for a season, then above, -O Lamb of God, I come.

On behalf of the gardening team for St Mary's and St John's I'd like to say thank you for the compliments and thank yous we have received regarding the church gardens. As a group of volunteers, our ethos is to ensure God's houses have a welcoming path and acts to invite individuals to have a moment or two of pleasure and peaceful reflection whether going to the church or passing by. Over the past few years, we have worked towards creating planting that invites the wildlife which supports the Eco Church

including the Love Your Burial Ground and Count on Nature campaigns.

We work to nurture plants that are low maintenance and can survive in dry weather. Some places are intentionally left in a managed untidy state to encourage wildlife. In other places some plants are left to self-seed and naturalize. Having cleared an area that was very over grown by the church hall a few years ago we have created a wild flower patch. Along with tending the flower beds we do like to clear graves when time permits and keep the general areas looked after. One project we started is to clear St Mary's carpark of the brambles. It is a big job so if anyone is up for helping clear the area let us know by contacting Sam in the church office.

Gardening can be very healthy on so many levels and a social activity with the team and people who walk by and stop to chat. We are always happy to have volunteers join the team. We share our weeks between St Mary's and St John's on a Tuesday morning 9:30 to 12:00. It's a great activity if you've just retired too. If you like to get outdoors, love to hear and see wildlife, have a few hours

of time to volunteer and don't mind getting a little dirty come and join us help tend God's garden.



Focus on Mission

Outward Giving 2023 Sharing the love of Jesus with all people Matthew 28:16-20

[fusion]SPAIN

In Spain there are two university semesters - the first ending with January exams, and the second going from the end of February through to June exams. So we're slowly approaching the end of our first full academic year in Granada, and it has been quite a learning curve for us!

This term has been one of two halves for us, with some new doors opening in Granada and in other places here, and a trip to the UK in March in the middle. Here are some of the breakthroughs from this last term and places we're seeing God move:

















- 1. *Our Brand New Website:* a simple thing, but it feels like an exciting step forward for us, as it makes Fusion Spain more of an official thing and gives us a shop window, so that people can better understand what we do and trust us more easily.
- 2. *First Small Groups Training in Spain:* Part of the key training we offer to churches as Fusion is training their students to lead small groups that multiply. We got to do our first of these training days with a church in Madrid in April. Alain, the group leader, sent me this message [translated], "everyone I've spoken to about today has said how good it was and how they appreciated how you shared knowledge and passion in such a simple and practical way different to any training we've had on this before!" very encouraging for us as a start to learning how to use this training here in Spain and what it has to offer the church.
- 3. Alpha & New Small Groups: We have been helping the catholic diocese student group run an alpha to get the group going again after a new & brilliant priest took it on this year. This has been a brilliant door into a different world for us, and we are now using Fusion training to train those who have completed Alpha to lead small groups that multiply an amazing opportunity for us to learn how to equip people in the catholic context to reach students! This training we have has so much potential to transform campus in the hands of catholics!
- 4. Local Church: Our local church continues to be a main focus of our prayers, but we are grateful for the ways we are starting to see God breakthrough, and have particularly been enjoying Thursday evenings, when a girl who is new to our church and from a nominal catholic family has been inviting lots of her nominal catholic friends round to our house to read the Bible together and talk about Jesus!
- 5. *Relationship Building:* It's important to us to keep building relationships with more churches and ministries around Spain, partly to support and encourage each-other, partly to learn more of the context here, but also to be able to serve and be better known around the country. At the end of April we had an opportunity like this with a very well-known church in Spain who held a national conference (gathering all their different church plants around the Country), and invited us to do some of the seminars. A brilliant opportunity to build relationship with them and meet more people.

Brief Summary of Things to be Praying for:

Local relationships and local church:

God really is up to something here and we really feel there are a few key people for us to be investing in at this time - some students and some leaders. We ask for your prayers because we believe that God is wanting to unite his church and pour his Spirit out, so would these people and relationships spark that!

Wisdom in decision-making:

Constantly living outside of our comfort zone means that our energy is still limited, and coming to the end of the academic year, we are certainly feeling it. Please pray for wisdom in knowing what to initiate, what to prioritise now and what to leave for the future.

Board Members:

We feel more positive about this having spent time with some brilliant leaders recently who God has put in our path from the beginning. Please be praying for God to speak to them about Fusion and speak clearly to us about who to ask!

Thank you so much for your continued support of us, and your prayers. We are so grateful, and so aware that we only get to do this because of what you guys and others like you sow into it. May you be truly blessed in all that you give.

need to be a big birthday in order to add cake to the menu!


