#### The text of Cathy's Easter Morning Sermon

Holy Saturday is such a nothing day! Can you imagine what it was like for those first disciples – Jesus had gone to his death without an explanation and they are lost, bewildered, devastated. It's not so hard for us, because we know what comes next: that Jesus will rise, but for them – emptiness. We have to hold together the sadness of Good Friday with the joy of Easter Sunday.

I was at Guildford Cathedral recently for the installation of Archdeacon Catharine Mabuza. She and several of the Cathedral priest vicars wore beautifully embroidered cloaks. Now I was struck by the colours. The cloaks are red and gold. I always like colours and in church these are often meaningful. We have different liturgical colours for different seasons. Red is for passion, death, blood and gold is for celebration and, at Easter, resurrection. Here, there is **red and gold together**. Death and life. We have to hold together Jesus' death on Good Friday with Jesus' new life on Easter Sunday morning: Suffering and glory; sadness and celebration; conflict and peace; disappointment and joy; darkness and light; sin and forgiveness; passion and resurrection; death and new life.



This year there have been highs and lows; this Lent there have been highs and lows; even in this last two weeks there have been highs and lows. For us, there's probably no deeper sadness than losing a family member or close friend. And this can bring back other bereavements to us as well.

Two weeks ago, we lost our friend Amy. And we pray for her husband and children that God is comforting them in their loss and assuring them of his immeasurable love for them. The wonderful flip side of our grief is that Amy, with her firm faith in Jesus, is alive with him in glory now. And that is the difference



Easter makes. We can be sure that the life after is secured for each of us and we can live in that light now. The resurrection of Jesus makes ALL the difference.

This last two weeks for me has had highs and lows: there has been the joy of a family wedding, the stress of an Ofsted at Ashley school, another family gathering, as well as this deep sadness and a fabulous conversation with a man called Tony. His story reminds us that, most wonderfully, God is changing the lives of people around us.

I spoke to Tony at Encounter Easter on Good Friday and the story of Jesus conquering death is coming alive to him as never before. He used to drop his partner off to church at St John's and return and pick her up. Then people at The Four started to chat to him and someone invited him to the Alpha course. Tony has come to faith in Jesus over the last couple of months, his life has been transformed by meeting Jesus. Now he doesn't want to miss a service!!

Highs and lows. Deep sadness and joy. Have you noticed that often in life, really good things and really hard things come at exactly the same time. It's as if when God is at work making beautiful things happen, the devil digs his oar in and brings trouble. Like Good Friday, and Easter Sunday, like the cloak – red and gold: suffering and glory, passion and resurrection, death and new life.

I don't know if you've ever been on a roller coaster. I don't do roller coasters. We used to take our children to Thorpe Park when they were teenagers and just younger, but tall enough to reach the critical height bar! But I would always be the one standing there with the coats watching. I watched them go up high and down low again and again. It is moving and dynamic and this is really what life is like – we move through highs and lows, and God's Holy Spirit is with us in them all. In fact, God's spirit transforms our sadness to joy and our fear to hope and our loss to gain.

We can enjoy the celebrations and joys while they are there, we mustn't let the disappointments swamp us. Because we know what the **resurrection** means - Jesus has beaten death, he is the winner, he has conquered death and we have been set free. As Andrew Ollerton says on the Bible Course, "We know the end of the story and *we are on the winning side.*"

As we contemplate death and life this Easter, sharpened by the loss of a friend, I think it's time to think about our own lives. Maybe it is a **nudge** to make you get on and do something God has been telling you to do. In one of the first conversations I had with

Amy when we arrived in Walton, she said "I know God wants me to do something and I think it is to do with children and young people". Since then she has consistently taken the next step in serving God in many different ways. She has stepped out of her comfort zone many times for God and she really made the most of each day. I love our Vison statement which says "we take our next steps..."

We all have one life to live. Is it time to step up in our service of God? Jesus is looking for people to be his hands and his feet – some people here are really good at pastoral care - what's the next step? Helping in the community café or toddler group? Maybe – a lay leader course, maybe Ordained ministry. There are loads of ways we can serve God and his people in line with the person God has made us to be. Or maybe it's trying to put a relationship right or breaking a bad habit and making a good choice. Here's a **nudge**. Don't wait. Do it now. Speak to Jonny or Cathy or Dave or send an email to one of us right now!

## Vicar News – EMDL June, July, August 2024

Jonny and Cathy have been granted a period of Extended Ministerial Development Leave (EMDL). This is a three-month period away from the parish, which combines space for self and God, refreshment, personal and professional development and reflection. The churchwardens and PCC know the Parish will be in the capable hands of Rev Dave Bixby whilst Jonny and Cathy are away.

As part of their EMDL, Jonny and Cathy will be returning to South Africa. They first arrived in South Africa in January 1994 - 30 years ago, just before the first multi-racial, democratic elections at the end of April that year. They arrived with two young children, a 3 year old and an 11 month old and returned 5 years later with their third child, who was born in South Africa. Whilst in South Africa they worked closely with the first Bishop of the Diocese of St. Mark the Evangelist in the northern part of South Africa, north of Pretoria, towards Zimbabwe. Jonny worked as Diocesan Secretary, the right-hand man to the Bishop, running the administration and finances of the Diocese. The Diocese still follows the vision that both Jonny and Cathy were instrumental in developing. They will be staying with the Bishop and have been asked to preach at a large festival for a modern-day Saint Manche Masemola, whose statue is above Westminster Abbey's great west door; hers is one of ten statues to modern martyrs; Christians who gave up their lives for their beliefs. They will also meet some of the people they worked with and assess the impact of the vision on the life and ministry of the Church over the years across the geographically huge Diocese.
